






Image	Title, Author and Description

Faced with a magic cake, a grinning cat and a noisy Queen, Alice doesn't know what will happen next. This is an ideal introduction to this beloved classic for younger children.</p>
	<p><u>A Lullaby for Little One by Dawn Casey</u></p> <p><i>“when suddenly a White Rabbit with pink eyes ran close by her.”</i></p> <p>There's time for just one last game before bedtime for little Bunny and Big Daddy Rabbit. "Alice was beginning to get very tired of sitting by her sister on the bank, and of having nothing to do;"



"this here ought to have been a red rose-tree, and we put a white one in by mistake;"



"the locks were too large, or the key was too small."



"When she had come close to it, she saw clearly that it was Humpty Dumpty himself"



“I could tell you my adventures – beginning from this morning,” said Alice”



“After these came the royal children: there were ten of them,”



“A Mad Tea- Party”



“It's a friend of mine – a Cheshire Cat”


