
# Data update

These data were reported to the Local Outbreak Management Cell on 15<sup>rd</sup> September 2020 by the Public Heath Manager at Slough Borough Council. These data are received on a daily basis and are contextualised by the knowledge of the attendees at the Cell meetings.

#### Overall - Increased cases with flat trend:

#### Infection rates

- Rate of new cases in Slough continues to plateau with 7-day rolling average rate of new cases higher than South East but lower than England average
- Rise in 111 calls but no rise in 999 call rates. This is due to patients with sessional cough and cold seeking assurance and also trying to access testing.
- Since the first peak in April and there have been two upticks in cases in Slough, both community transmission.
- There have been no outbreaks in schools and other high risk settings since last meeting. All single case incidents are being managed as per PHE guidance.



#### Confirmed cases for residents of Slough (Pillar 1 and 2)

Please note: PHE advise that data for the most recent five days should always be considered as incomplete and will be retrospectively updated as new cases are confirmed.



#### Death rates

 All cause mortality rate remains currently below the seasonal with no new covid related deaths in last reported week of death data (w/e 4 Sep)

- NHS testing site being stood up in Bracknell for East Berkshire key workers and families to support gap in pillar 2 testing.

## **Local Contact Tracing:**

- The local contract tracing cell set up to work with PHE in establishing the local systems.
- Slough had met all measures/ requirements set up by PHE with great confidence.
- LA go live date is 17th Sep 20 when Slough starts getting the list of cases.
