**Section 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Regulation 23 of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 as amended.**

**The borough of Slough (prescribed routes) Order 2024 (Order 23 of 2024)**

1. Slough Borough Council makes this Order in exercise of its powers under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the Act”) and any other enabling powers.

2. This Order may be cited as the Borough of Slough (Prescribed Routes) Order 2024 and shall come into operation on the 25 April 2024 as stated in its notice of making.

3. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-

“Authorised Vehicle” means any Vehicle belonging to a person whose usual residence or place of business is at a premise with a postal address on the Prohibited Road and the driver or passenger of said Vehicle can produce a valid School Street Permit issued by Slough Borough Council.

“Prescribed Hours” means between 8.15 a.m. and 9.00 a.m. and between 3.00 p.m. and 3.45 p.m. on Mondays to Friday inclusive during Holy Family Catholic School term times.

4. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, while the Order is in operation no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to enter, leave, or proceed in the Prohibited Road, as set out in the Schedule to this Order during the prescribed hours

5. Nothing in Article 4 to this Order shall apply to:-

- a) an authorised vehicle;
- b) a pedal cycle;
- c) any vehicle being used for Police, Ambulance or Fire Brigade purposes in an emergency;
- d) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform

**Revocation**

6. The Borough of Slough (Prescribed School Routes - Holy Family Catholic School) Experimental) Order 2022 (Order 44 of 2022) is revoked in its entirety by this Order.


