Coproduction Celebration Event Report July 2024



The Slough Coprodction Network (CPN) hosted an event to mark the National coproduction week celebrating coproduction in Slough. The event was held at Chalvey Community Hub on 9th July 2024.

The aim of the event was to:

- Promote Slough's approach to Coproduction.
- > Understand the role of the CPN and the work it has been involved in
- Hear about other projects in Slough that have adopted a Coproduction approach.
- Showcase how Coproduction has a positive influence in health and adult social care services in Slough.

Volunteer members from the CPN had a key role in planning and hosting the event. They shared their personal experiences of what Coproduction means to them and how they have developed their skills and grown in confidence since being part of the network. They described their role in being involved in projects including adult social care strategy development and commissioning activities. We also welcomed other organisations in Slough that have a Coproduction approach to promote their projects and share their positive accounts.

Senior leaders from Slough Borough Council gave their commitment to ensuring that residents would be involved in future decisions.

We were delighted that over 100 people came together to network and be part of the celebrations. This included Slough residents, health and social care staff, partner organisations and the mayor.

'Step together', a dance group for people with learning disabilities, supported by the Creative Academy, performed a lively dance which was enjoyed by all - they brought lots of energy to the room!
