First Aid

 The first training provide by Slough CVS was excellent, in this session, we learned that if you call 999 and are unable to speak you can press 55, the call can be traced. Also learned on the course is that during a cardiac emergence mouth to mouth resuscitation is no longer practiced, chest compression is sufficient.

Safeguarding

- We had excellent training for safeguarding awareness and how to report any safeguarding concerns.
- We had people from other organisation and members of the public involved in volunteering which made the course livelier and more interactive.
